## **Communication and** Language

We will be publishing pictures of your child's learning on Tapestry. Please discuss the photographs with your child. This will support your child's learning in many ways and when they get the hang of it, it will be such a lovely experience for you to share with your child. Ask open questions like:

What are you doing here? Who are you with? Why did you use that colour? What is your favourite part? What are you going to do tomorrow? Please add exciting and significant moments

#### **Phonics**

Practise Fred Talk games with your child to encourage verbal blending skills © e.g.

Fred says "Touch your I-e-q", Fred says "Touch your h-a-nd" Remember to make the game as fun as possible.

# Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Talk to your child about the new friends they have made in school, can they name them all?

Ask your child what they think it means to be a good friend, how can we be a good friend?

Ask your child what makes them special, what are they good at? What do they enjoy? What do they enjoy about school so far?

## **Physical Development**

To support your child's gross motor skill development you could:

- Practise turning our clothes the right way out.
- Practise putting our own wellies on and going for an autumn walk, discussing the colours that you can see.
- Ask your child to help sweep up outside or clean the windows (Seriously © this will build their shoulder muscles needed for writing)

To support your child's fine motor skill development you could:

- Practise writing our own name.
- Have a go at a little sewing
- Fancy a challenge? Fastening and unfastening buttons

## **Understanding the World**

Look at different pictures of animals in books or on the internet and discuss what makes them the same and different.

Play snap with animal picture cards.

Visit the library and look at different non-fictions books about animals.

Ask your child to take some pictures of their pets at home or animals they see on a walk and share them on Tapestry to discuss.

Go on an Autumn walk and discuss the changes that you can see in the environment.
